

Ladies Program Announced

Ladies attending the luncheon hosted on Friday, June 19 by Vi Andersen will enjoy a program presented by Rhonda Andersen Morse entitled **Mission Sudan**. Travel with Rhonda as she recounts her journey in January, 2009 with Moses Joknhial II, one of the Lost Boys of Sudan, to his homeland and their mission of providing educational opportunities to the children – especially girls – in his home village of Pajut. Hear Rhonda's account of Moses' escape as a child from his war torn country in 1987 and the challenges and joys of returning with him 22 years later.



Rhonda Andersen Morse is a native of Hetland, South Dakota. She attended elementary school in Hetland and Lake Preston High School, and is a graduate of the University of South Dakota.

Rhonda is a biologist with special interest in immunogenetics and transplantation and worked in a supervisory role in the immunogenetics laboratory, matching recipients and donors for organ transplants, at Northwestern University Medical School for eighteen years. While living in Chicago, she tutored disadvantaged youth in the inner city.

After moving to Sioux Falls, her medical background led to performing research studies of the Hutterites living in South Dakota. Since 2001, her focus has been mentoring the Lost Boys of Sudan who worship in her church, The Church of the Holy Apostle. Because of her involvement with the Lost Boys and for humanitarian reasons, Rhonda became interested in Sudan's peace process and working to help people of South Sudan rebuild their lives through education.
