## **PIERRE MASONIC BUILDING BOARD**

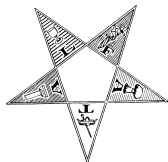
The stated Building Board meeting is taking place on the 27<sup>th</sup> and is the same time that the Masonic Messenger is in the process of being produced and mailed.

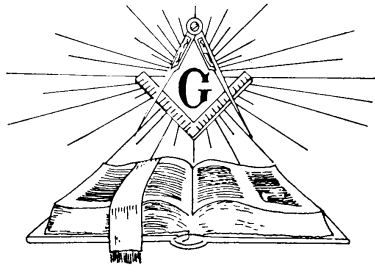

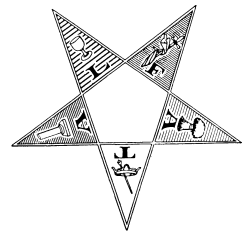
